£68 was raised in total which was donated to the womens charity 'Breast Cancer Now'. This charity was chosen by the Student Council as the donations they receive goes towards both research into the disease and also offers support to all those affected.

On Friday 21st March our student council joined the national effort to raise money for Comic Relief. So far the charity has raised over £34 million for worth while causes in the UK and abroad. In school we sold 'red-nose' pin badges at break and lunch time, which the students were keen to pin on their lanyards. We were able to donate £44 to the well deserved charity.

## **INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY**

During National Careers Week and in celebration of International Women's Day, students from Longdendale High School took part in a series of inspiring activities designed to foster excellence and ambition. The week showcased the Trust's vision of Excellence and Ambition for All, offering students invaluable insights into diverse industries and empowering them to dream big.

One of the week's highlights was the "Empowering Futures" event hosted by Stamford Park Trust. Students had the unique opportunity to explore careers in fields where women are often underrepresented, such as the Army, Construction, and Engineering.

Trailblazing women from Stamford Products Ltd, The RAF, and Russell WBHO shared their stories, offering practical advice and shedding light on the possibilities available to young women in these dynamic sectors. Students participated in engaging activities, asked thoughtful questions, and left feeling inspired to pursue their ambitions.

The wisdom and inspiration of women within our own communities was also celebrated. Female teachers, support staff, and leaders shared the quotes they live by and the advice they would offer to young women.

## **APPRENTICESHIP WEEK AND NATIONAL CAREERS WEEK**

Tameside College held a presentation for students in Years 7 - 10 during National Apprenticeship Week, explaining how apprenticeships combine real work with training and study. Students learnt that apprenticeships are on offer in a range of sectors and explored the routes into these.

Throughout National Careers Week, students engaged in a range of activities. Careers-themed lessons took place across all subjects ensuring every student gained valuable insights into career pathways. A whole-school careers quiz challenged students to match teachers to their qualifications and career journeys.

Year 10 students welcomed Ada National College for Digital Skills for an exciting session on digital careers, including workshops in Computer Science. A small group of Year 10 students also visited the University of Manchester and took part in a careers workshop, enriching their understanding of future opportunities.



# **ASPIRATION DAY**

Students across school took part in a wide selection of activities on our second Aspiration Day of the year, designed to give them information on career choices and broaden their future aspirations.

Huge thanks to Tameside College who gave students in Years 7 – 10 a fantastic experience with 'Tameside Explore' – introducing students to the breath of options open to them in the future, whether that be future study or the world of work with interactive workshops linked to technical qualifications. Students enjoyed hands on

Year 7 took part in a murder mystery with a focus on finding and looking after evidence. They then took part in a fantastic practical drama/film making workshop with our alumni guest, Ciaran Moss.

Students in Year 8 linked in with British Science Week and amongst other activities explored the effects of acid rain on bird's eggs and the differences between natural and manmade fibres.

Year 9 were introduced to the options process as they start to choose which subjects they'd like to study at GCSE next year.

Students in Year 10 learnt about extremism and conflict and looked at careers in ICT and the media. Many thanks to our guest speaker, Emily Smith, Head of Data Science at Pets at Home for educating our students about data science and how this is used by companies throughout the world.

Year 11 concentrated on preparing for their GCSE exams in the summer with walk-through mock exams. Students also focused on either cross-curriculum maths to support geography and other subjects or undertook intervention in specific subjects to maximise their chances of success.

Thank you to everyone who helped make this Aspiration Day so enjoyable and successful. Students gained knowledge that will ultimately help them make informed decisions about what they would like to achieve in the future.
