Each academic year, you will take part in **three electives**, with each elective aligned to one of our **Pillars of Excellence**. By choosing electives across the different pillars, you demonstrate both the breadth of your character and your commitment to the *Longdendale Legacy*.

ACADEMIC ELECTIVE

This elective focuses on deepening your knowledge beyond the classroom. You will develop a love of lifelong learning, confidence in critical and enquiry-based thinking, and the ability to apply problem-solving approaches to both conceptual and practical challenges.

PHYSICAL HEALTH & WELLBEING ELECTIVE

Physical health and wellbeing are essential to living a healthy, successful life. These electives help you build strength, stamina, resilience, flexibility, teamwork, and coordination. You'll also learn strategies to support positive mental health and wellbeing, such as mindfulness.

COMMUNITY & LEADERSHIP ELECTIVE

As a community school, we are proud to strengthen our links with the wider community. We have worked with residential care homes, primary schools, nurseries, churches, and food banks - and we're passionate about helping you make a difference. These electives help you develop leadership, collaboration, oracy, and project-based learning skills, empowering you to support others and build confidence.

You must choose **four electives** that you would like to study in the **Spring Term**. During tutor time, your tutor will record your choices in order of preference. While we will do our best to allocate your first choice, this cannot be guaranteed, so please consider your reserve options carefully.

From Year 7 to Year 10, you will take part in **12 electives**, helping you to develop both your personal growth and cultural capital. Throughout each elective, your teacher will assess your participation, attendance, and behaviour, which will contribute to your Legacy Certificate at one of four levels: **Bronze, Silver, Gold, or Platinum**.

Electives are a compulsory part of our offer for all students. Once assigned, choices cannot be changed for timetabling reasons. Electives commence on Wednesday, 7th January 2026 for the Spring Term and take place from 2:35pm – 3:30pm.

ANCIENT WORLDS

Civilisations and their Secrets

Open to:

Years 7 & 8



Overview

In this elective, students will embark on a journey through the ancient world, exploring how great civilisations rose, flourished, and sometimes mysteriously disappeared. They will investigate the secrets of ancient societies, uncovering how geography, innovation, and belief shaped human progress.

Through hands-on activities, creative projects, and storytelling, students will develop their curiosity, critical thinking, and historical inquiry skills. By the end of the course, they will have a deeper appreciation of how the achievements and mysteries of the ancient world continue to influence the modern era.

The Mind and Mastery of Chess

Overview

This elective is based on a two-player board game where the objective is to checkmate the opponent's king by strategically manoeuvring 16 pieces, and it is important because it develops crucial cognitive skills like problem-solving, planning, and critical thinking. The game's importance extends to real life as it fosters patience, teaches how to weigh consequences, and provides a framework for strategic thinking that can be applied to many other situations and challenges.

In this Graphic Design elective, students create a clothing brand from scratch, designing a unique logo and a series of print advertisements. Using Inkscape and Photoshop, you will develop a visual identity for your brand and select a celebrity to endorse it. This project blends creativity with what it is like to work as a graphic designer on a real-world project, giving students hands-on experience in branding, digital design, and the importance of a well designed brand.

Overview

The key components of this animal welfare elective is based on an animal's five key welfare needs (health, environment, nutrition, behaviour and companionship). This course will identify common health issues around a variety of species, along with prevention. We will also look at dietary requirements of a variety of species, along with the basic accommodation requirements in order to maintain good health and behaviour. Within the course we will also look at the ethics and laws around keeping and caring for animals.

In this elective students will get the opportunity to bake a variety of sweet and savoury bakes. Students will learn and use a range of skills including, different mixing techniques, knife skills, how to measure ingredients accurately and making and working with bread and pastry dough. The bakes will include cookies, gingerbread, flapjacks, apple pie, brownies, fruit scones, iced buns, cheesy garlic bread, pizza twists and cheese pasties. We will also have a session where we taste a range of different breads and biscuits and think about what makes them different and which ones we like and why.
