

Year 7 - History

Curriculum intent	The Year 7 history curriculum is designed to give students a foundation of knowledge and skills for further study. The first term is a thematic study of migration over time, focusing on change, continuity and significance. This allows students to build connections between the local history of Manchester and the wider world and gives them a chronological schema, from Romans to the present day, on which to build their further understanding. The second two terms develop a narrative of the concept of power in England in the Middle Ages and Early Modern periods. By the end of Year 7, students will be able to make inferences from historical sources and write coherently about change and continuity in the Church, state and monarchy between 1066 & 1688. This will give students the foundation to explore deeper and more complex studies of power in Year 8 and beyond.
